
Points to Ponder

- The US ranks 64th in the World in income inequality
- The US is 10th place in intergenerational mobility among developed countries
- The US economy and jobs creation is not from the wealthy but from the US middle class
- Investments are not being made in new plants or new businesses, but for the most part into financial securities:
 - While 6% of the cost of an Apple iPhone is from the US while \$159 billion of its cash holdings are sitting in offshore banks
 - US multi-national businesses have \$1.64 trillion sitting in overseas banks
 - \$2.54 Trillion sitting in US Banks, Total \$4.18 Trillion

1917-2012






US Low Intergenerational Mobility Ranking




The link between individual and parental earnings varies across OECD countries
