**October 30 is National Weatherization Day**

October is the perfect month to prepare your home for the upcoming Michigan winter. Installing weather stripping around windows and doors, beefing up the insulation in the attic and walls, and getting a furnace tune up are just a few of the common steps we can take to ensure a warm and cozy home throughout the colder months.

But such commonplace measures can be beyond the means of many low income families and the higher heating bills that result place an additional economic burden on an already struggling household. And that's where [Michigan's Weatherization Assistance Program](#) can help!

In Michigan, the Weatherization Assistance Program is primarily administered by the [state's 29 Community Action Agencies](#). These services reduce energy use and lower utility bills, thus creating more self-sufficient households. As part of a nationwide network of Weatherization Operators, Michigan's Community Action Agencies are taking part in a celebration throughout October, with activities culminating on October 30 as [National Weatherization Day](#), which recognizes the benefits of the program in reducing the energy burden for low income families, promotes health and safety, improves the housing stock, and creates and sustains thousands of jobs in the energy efficiency sector.

**MCA Supports CCAP Students with Study Group**





MCA encourages our staff from our member agencies to become a Certified Community Action Professional (CCAP). This certification is designed for current and emerging managers or leaders in the Community Action Profession and is administered by the CCAP Commission. To achieve certification, employment in either a CAA, a delegate agency or sub-grantee of a CAA, a CSBG eligible entity, a state or regional association office, or a state community services program office is required.

- CCAP gives members visible recognition for their accomplishments in the field. CCAP enhances the credentials of Community Action staff.
- CCAP provides an edge in competing for public and private grant funds.
- CCAP improves members' professional marketability when competing for jobs.
- CCAP establishes standards that encourage future community action leaders to carry on the quality work of the movement's founders.

MCA will continue its support of members seeking the CCAP credential by hosting a study group throughout 2018-19. (Current dates are October 9, November 20, and January 29.) The sessions will be facilitated by a national expert and CCAP Emeritus Charles McCann who brings a career's worth of experience and dedication to the ideals of Community Action to the group and individual members.
