



2013 Charles Braithwait Leadership Award

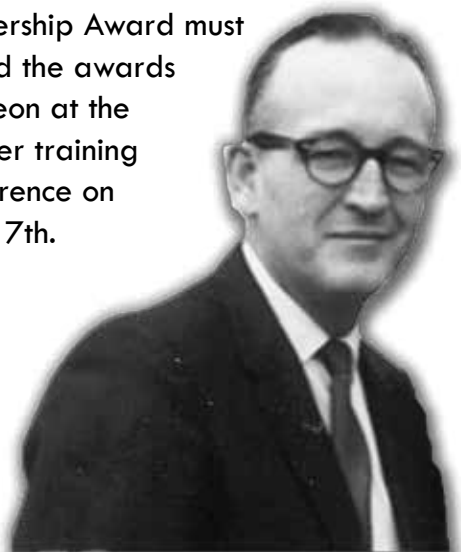
Charles Braithwait began his career in Community Action at West Central Missouri Community Action Agency in 1965.

He was one of the founders of the National Community Action Foundation and was appointed by President Gerald Ford to the Commission for Economic Development.

In 1973, President Richard Nixon ordered the dismantlement of Community Action Agencies across the country. Charles Braithwait on behalf of West Central Missouri Community Action Agency, filed a lawsuit to prevent this action and won!

In that spirit of leadership, Missouri's premier Community Action Award is given to someone in the Missouri Community Action Network who exemplifies the spirit of energy and dedication demonstrated by Charles Braithwait.
